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Rainbows Academy Provides Trusted Early Childhood Education in an Inclusive Environment

From the beginning Rainbows has come alongside families to provide a safe environment that fosters growth and learning for children. Early on the need for high-quality childcare for children of all abilities was realized. The need is still high today and Rainbows has recently launched Rainbows Academy, an all-day, year-round, inclusive preschool and Pre-Kindergarten for children 30 months through age five.

Rainbows Academy is an environment where children build confidence, make friends, and become kindergarten ready through a hands-on, play-based environment.

"Young children spend a lot of time in our care," said Misty Weiss, Rainbows Academy Coordinator. "It's a unique opportunity in an environment that helps them grow and flourish."

Misty wants families to know children will learn at their own pace in a safe, fun environment along with their peers.

"By serving children of all abilities in our classrooms we can give young children the opportunity to experience first-hand what it's like to have a friend who may move, eat or learn differently than they do," said Misty. "They can ask questions and gain understanding of the bigger world they will encounter as they get older."

Parents have been impressed with Rainbows' inclusive childcare for years. Michael Redondo's son Declan has been enrolled at Rainbows' Kids' Point since fall of 2022.

"Declan was never enrolled at Rainbows to address any developmental issues, but because of the integrated dynamic of the classrooms, he has grown to identify his classmates by their souls rather than by their visible disabilities and/or devices," said Michael.

"I've always had a passion for children," said Misty. "My goal is to make each child in our care feel loved and encouraged every day."


Partner Celebrates Century of Service

Honoring Steve Cox: A Legacy of Service and Heart

Since joining the Rainbows Board in 2003, Steve Cox has been a steady, compassionate leader, shaping the organization with both his business expertise and his deep care for children and families. He was first invited to serve by his friend and fellow Board Member, John Frazee.

"It was a time in my life when I wanted to get more involved in the community," Steve recalls. "John knew Rainbows could provide that experience. Little did I know how important Rainbows would become for my family."

Now retired from Cox Machine—a company his father founded and his son, Jason, now leads as President— Steve reflects on giving back as one of life's greatest gifts. During his tenure, he helped guide Rainbows through challenging seasons and celebrated countless joyful moments: Pre-K graduations, Camp Talent Shows, and 10:15+ Club events honoring long-time staff with fun-filled, surprise adventures.

In 2005, Rainbows' mission became personal. Steve's granddaughter, Mykel, was born medically fragile and needed early intervention services.

"Rainbows was there for my son, daughter-in-law, and Mykel," Steve shares. "We learned first-hand just how vital these services are for a family navigating the unknown. Rainbows was there for all of us."

When Mykel passed away in 2009, Steve was facing both personal heartbreak and the organization's financial

restructuring. His commitment to Rainbows—and the families it serves—helped him push through the darkest days of grief with renewed purpose.

"Steve is a quiet man who leads with great strength, faith, and optimism," said former President Deb Voth.
"His business skills helped guide Rainbows for more than two decades, securing a strong future for children and families in our community."

In 2010, Steve was honored with the prestigious InterHab President's Award for his significant and effective response to the needs of individuals with disabilities. The moment his name was called, the room erupted in cheers and a standing ovation—a testament to the admiration and respect he has earned.

Among his proudest moments was chairing Fashion Passion in 2021 alongside his wife, Janis, son Jason, and daughter-in-law Bree. "It was such an honor to lead this event with our family," Steve said. "Rainbows has meant so much to us. It was our joy to give back in this way." "Rainbows is a unique and special place close to my heart," Steve says.

Thank you, Steve, for your remarkable service—22 years on the Rainbows Board of Directors and 17 years with the Rainbows United Charitable Foundation. Your leadership, generosity, and steadfast heart have left an enduring mark. Rainbows continues to shine brighter because of you.
